Week 4

ELA

Language- Using a book, find contractions. Write the contraction and the two words used to create the contraction. (Ex. don't – do not)

Reading- Fold a paper into 4 or 6 squares. Draw and/or write a comic. Show cause/effect relationships throughout your comic.

Reading- Choose a book to read, when you're finished reading the book, draw a picture of the main character. Then create a list of inside/outside traits. (See attached page to help with traits if needed)

Math

Measurement- Make a paper airplane or "snowball". Throw it 3 times and measure how far it went each time. Could you make changes to make it go further? Adjust your design, try again, and measure!

Addition- YOU'RE THE TEACHER! Create an addition practice page. You will need 10 questions with 2 digit numbers (33 + 52). Once you're done, solve the equations. Have a parent/sibling/guardian check your work!

Graphing- Flip a coin 10, 20, or 30 times. Make a tally each time it lands on heads or tails. Graph your results.

Dig Deeper **Social Studies**- Think of your house, your yard, or your street. Maybe even think of your dream playground. Draw a map to show your thoughts. Be sure to include a title, compass rose, and key on your map! Create 3 questions that could be answered using your map. See if a family member can answer the questions using your map!
